BARE THE AREA

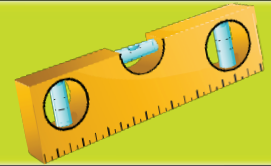
Be sure to remove any debris or old turf! You can also add good quality topsoil before sodding. You can use a rototiller, rake, or a small sod cutter for this step.



2

GRADE SURFACES

Carefully level all surfaces that are going to be sodded. Soil surfaces should be 1 inch below walkways, patios, & driveways.

FERTILIZE THE AREA

We recommend applying 14-25-10 fertilizer before or after laying the sod. It has a higher level of phosphorus which promotes root growth.

LAY YOUR FRESH SOD

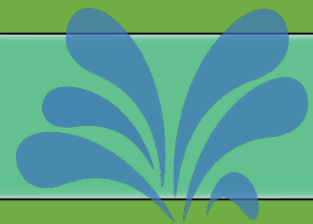
Lay your sod as close to delivery as you can! This will help to avoid overheating. **WARNING:** Do not water sod when on pallet.

WATER, WATER, WATER

Don't wait until the whole area is sodded! Start watering as soon as there is a 'sprinkler size' area to water.

ROLL FRESH SOD

Rolling your sod will help to ensure effective root to soil contact. It will also help to eliminate air pockets!

KEEP MOIST

The key to establishing new sod is to keep it properly watered.

IMPORTANT

- Water 1 to 3 times a day
- Watering can be reduced, depending on the season
- Do NOT allow sod to dry out, keep it moist
- Do NOT count on rain being enough water
